Meeting Minutes

January 22, 2014

Rock County Sheriff's Office – Large Conference Room

The quarterly meeting of the Rock County Traffic Safety Commission was held on January 22, 2014, at the Sheriff's Office at 9:00AM. Present were: Hank Brill, Dennis Ryan, Mike Flesch, Barbara Abraham, Tom, Dunkin, Adam Pritchard, Dan Molland, Dan Davis, Kathy Fozerde (Gazette), Jude Maurer and Pat Swartout.

Capt. Maurer called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. and asked for introductions around the table.

Dennis Ryan motioned to approve the minutes of October 16, 2013. The motion was seconded by Barb Abraham. Motion passed unanimously.

Fatal accidents reviewed

- October 7, 2013 – 1 Vehicle/1 Deceased. Speed, along with lack of safety equipment are contributing factors. Alcohol unknown. Video was reviewed. When interviewed, mother of the deceased admits to the deceased being a heroin addict. Capt. Maurer will contact Coroner for a follow up report at the next Traffic Safety meeting.
- November 30, 2013 – 2 Vehicle/1 Injured/3 Deceased. Safety equipment used. Inattentive driving. Alcohol unknown.

Ryan Mayer presented a 6 year study of collisions at the intersection of USH 14 and STH 11. WisDot is prepared to regrind rumble strips and upsize the right arrow sign at intersection.

Old Business

Capt. Maurer recently attended a Traffic Safety meeting in Green Bay where he heard favorable discussions regarding the diverging diamond concept.

New Business

Ryan Mayer discussed the High Risk Rural Road Program. 4.2 miles of County Road X has been chosen to receive the \$90K in funding for upgrades.
