

Order for Laying out a Road November 9th 1852

We the Supervisors of the town of Fulton Rock County, Wis. do certify upon the application of six or more freeholders of said Town asking for the laying out of a Public Highway in the Town of Fulton, to wit: Commencing at the Canal Bridge at the North end of State Street in Fulton Village in Section 18 in said town; thence in a Northerly direction across the Catfish River and across the marsh up into the ravine (following the road as now travelled) thence North following the North Ravine on the most practicable route across the N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 18 to the North line of said Section. Also beginning at North W. corner of said Section 18, and S.W. corner of Section 7 in said Town; thence East on the Section line between said Sections till it meets the highway running East & West between Sec. 8 and 17 in said town:

That we caused notice to be posted up in writing in three of the most public places in said Town of Fulton specifying the road above named proposed for a highway and the time and place at which we would meet to make examination of the same, which notice was posted up at least ten days before said meeting; and we do further certify that being fully satisfied that that the notice required by law had been given pursuant to Statute; we on this ninth day of November 1852, it being the specified time in said notices met at the hour and place therein named, examined and caused survey to be made of said proposed Highway, which is recorded in the Town Book in the town of Fulton Page 76, heard all the reasons for and against laying out the same; We are of the opinion that such Highway is necessary and proper and proceed to lay out the same. And now we therefore, the Supervisors aforesaid in and for said town do on this ninth day of November 1852 order and declare the abovescribed road (according to the survey above described) to be a public Highway four rods wide, and we do further order the same to be kept open as such pursuant to Statute and we do further certify that we have not assessed any damages to any person or persons and that no person or persons have claimed any for or on account of said Highway.
