Page 188 of Record (Alteration of Sharon Road) October 21, 1876

Recites---Minutes of a survey of the alteration of a highway
in the Town of LaPrairie.

Commencing at the lime stone planted in the ground in the
centerline of the North and South highway East of and adjacent
to the section line between Sections 5 and 6 of the Town of
LaPrairie. Said lime stone is 10 chains and 31 links North of
the South line and 50 links East of the West line of the North-
west quarter of Section 5; thence North $49^{\circ} 30'$ West, 16 chains
and 48 links to a lime stone planted in the ground in the center
of the Janesville and Racine road. Variation of the needle 6° East.

Page 203 of Record (Smith Road - highway notice)

Notice is hereby given that the supervisors of the Towns of
LaPrairie and Turtle will meet at the house of Wm. H. Stark
in the Town of LaPrairie on Friday, November 7th at nine o'clock
A.M. to consider and act upon certain petitions which have been
presented to them to lay out a certain road as follows: Begin-
ning at the intersection of the town line of the Town of LaPrairie
and Turtle with the centerline of the highway commonly called and
known as the Turtle Creek road on the North side of Turtle, or a
such other point in the center of said Turtle Creek Road as the
supervisors may see fit; thence Easterly on or a near to said
town line as the supervisors may deem best between the railroad
and the bayou; and upon land owned and occupied by Wm. Stark to
the center of Turtle Creek; thence East on or near said town line
and upon land owned and occupied by B. H. Smith on the North, and
by Artemus Smith on the South side of the town line to the center
line of a road or lane owned and used by B. H. Smith as a private
road; thence South along the center of said private road and upon
land owned and occupied on the East by Franklin Culver and by
Artemus Smith on the West side of said private road to the point
of intersection of said center line of said private road with the
centerline of the highway on the South side of Turtle Creek.
