

At a meeting of the Supervisors of said Town agreeable to previous notice and having examined and deliberated upon the subject herein embraced it is ordered and determined by the said Supervisors that a highway be taken up in said Town running North of the Sawmill; commencing North where the highway now crosses the line, Section 5 and South and taken up and discontinued as far as to Dorman Road intersects with the said highway and it is also ordered and determined by the said Supervisors that a highway be laid out in said Town of the width of four rods and have caused a Survey there of to be made as follows; Commencing where the highway now crosses the line of Section five running South on the line by L. Yorks house running thence from the place of beginning on said line sixty rods thence running in the South Easterly course till it intersects the line of the aforesaid highway the distance of one hundred and twenty rods from the point where the said highway crosses the said Section line number five (5).

Record of a Highway between Magnolia and Albany

At a meeting of the Supervisors of said town agreeable to previous notice and having examined and deliberated upon the Subject herein embraced it is ordered and determined by the said Supervisors that the highway be taken up; Commencing at the foot of the hill near Ambrose Spencers house and running to the quarter stake between Sections sixteen (16) and seventeen (17) in said town and it is also ordered and determined by the said Supervisors that a highway be laid out in said town of the width of four rods; Commencing at the foot of the hill near Ambrose Spencers house and running nearly on a strait line along the side hill to the quarter stake between Sections Sixteen (16) and seventeen (17).
