The grant provides funding of up to \$175,000 to develop and operate innovative programs that enhance and improve the quality and timeliness of forensic science and coroner services. Funds may be used for any of the following: Personnel; Computerization; Certain laboratory equipment; Medicolegal equipment; Accreditation; Education, Training and Certification; Facilities improvements; Certain administrative expenses; and/or to Provide needed services to the community. The programs to be funded must be geared toward overall forensic science and coroner functions and/or enhancements.

Specifically, the coroner's office is seeking at least one (1) portable body cooler (two units depending on the amount of the grant award) for daily and mass fatality response use; one (1) body lift (used to lift decedents onto holding racks inside the portable cooler); at least one (1) "Stryker Power-Pro" gurney/cot to better move and transport decedents (allows for single and multi-person use and will help prevent potential employee injuries from using old and outdated transport cot(s); certain software for enhanced case management, data tracking/sharing; certain computer software (including but not limited to bar coding software [for better tracking of evidence, toxicology, decedents, and numerous other uses]; newer and updated computers and related equipment (such as a PowerPoint projector for presentations, case reviews, child death review panels); digital fingerprinting system that would work hand-in-hand with the bar coding system and will enhance/improve on decedent identification, and will decrease potential county liability issues; and, other forensic medicolegal equipment that is in need of updating in order to meet national standards.
