WHEREAS, approximately 10,000 to 20,000 dogs and cats are not vaccinated in Rock County; and	
WHEREAS, the control and elimination of rabies in cats and dogs through vaccination remains the only cost effective way to protect humans from contracting the disease.	
NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly assembled on this 10 day of April 20 through April 26, 2014 as 'Rock County Rabies Awareness Week', and encourage all cat and dog owners to be responsible by having their pets vaccinated for rabies.
