AMENDING 2014 LAND CONSERVATION DEPARTMENT BUDGET TO OFFSET COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE PURCHASE OF AGRICULTURAL CONSERVATION EASEMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Land Conservation Department was allocated funding from the ATC Fund account in 2009, per Resolution 09-2B-219, to fund various conservation projects; and,

WHEREAS, a portion of the allocation was earmarked for the implementation of the Purchase of Agricultural Conservation Easements Program (PACE); and,

WHEREAS, the major funding component of the PACE program is the USDA-NRCS Agricultural Conservation Easement Program (ACEP) (formerly referred to as the Farm and Ranchland Preservation Program), which pays up to fifty percent (50%) of the Easement value; and,

WHEREAS, the ACEP guidelines require all easements funded must include a title insurance policy valued for the full purchase price and have a comprehensive conservation easement appraisal completed; and,

WHEREAS, the Land Conservation Department (LCD) purchases a preliminary title insurance policy valued at \$15,000 as part of the initial title search early in the PACE application process and purchases the remaining increment, which totals the full easement purchase price, prior to closing on the Easement acquisition; and,

WHEREAS, due to unforeseen delays, two easements that would have closed in 2013 were moved to early 2014, therefore the associated closing costs will also be incurred in 2014; and,

WHEREAS, an anticipated increase in applications in 2014 will cause a funding short fall for the associated appraisal and title insurance fees; and,

WHEREAS, the Land Conservation Committee requests a transfer from the ATC Fund account and to amend it's budget to reflect the costs associated with the aforementioned components of the PACE Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly assembled this 10 day of 500, 2014, amends the Land Conservation Department's budget as follows:

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This resolution requests that money be transferred into the Land Conservation PACE budget from the ATC account to cover costs associated with the Purchase of Agricultural Conservation Easement (PACE) program, specifically the cost of title insurance and appraisal fees.

The LCD experienced delays in the closing of two PACE easements in 2013 until 2014. Also, the LCD anticipates a greater number of applications for the program in 2014 than estimated during the development of the 2014 budget, which will create a budget shortfall. The LCD is expecting at least four new applications for the program in 2014.
