Amending 3.103 of the Rock County Code of Ordinances (Public Peace and Order, Part 1 – Traffic Code)

Now therefore be it resolved that the Rock County Board of Supervisors assembled this day of $\underbrace{November}$, 2022 does ordain as follows:

I. Section 3.103 of the Rock County Code of Ordinances shall be amended to read as follows (added text appears as <u>underlined</u>; deleted text appears as <u>struck through</u>):

3.103 Specific Speed Limits

2.8

In addition to all other limits incorporated by reference, no person shall drive in excess of the following limits unless different limits are indicated by official traffic signs.

- (1) 10 miles per hour at any point on the grounds of the Rock County Health Care Center.
- (2) County Trunk Highway "A"
 - (a) 45 miles per hour, Town of Magnolia, Rock County, from a point 1600 feet west of STH 213 easterly to STH 213, for a distance of 0.30 mile (1600 feet)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY Amending 3.103 of the Rock County Code of Ordinances (Public Peace and Order, Part 1 – Traffic Code)

Various changes have occurred in recent years regarding the County Trunk Highway (CTH) System. A portion of CTH MM was jurisdictionally transferred to the City of Janesville, CTH BT was newly constructed, and new access points such as Putman Parkway in the City of Milton have been added. These changes have brought the need to amend the speed limit ordinance.

In addition to the items listed above, a number of inconsistencies were observed and are addressed in this amended version. Inconsistencies addressed are items such as including the mileage and footage throughout the ordinance and following the CTH corridors consistently from north to south or west to east.

Additionally, there were distance errors we found in a few locations. This prompted a review of the speed limit locations with daily calibrated equipment. The speed limit locations were also verified against the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). In this review, some locations were off more than others and some adjustments were necessary to comply with the MUTCD and to match the ordinance with the in-field sign placement. The target tolerance used was 0.01 miles or 53 feet.

There are also some adjustments included for various reasons, such as, better defining which intersecting road is being referred to, specifically where there are offset intersections such as Hackbarth Road and CTH E. In this case, the language "(southerly intersection)" was added for clarity. Another adjustment included is on CTH K. This adjustment extends a 40 mile per hour zone southerly to an intersection with St. Lawrence Avenue, approximately 0.2 miles or 1,056 feet. This short segment is currently 55 mph, and travelers are speeding up from the intersection to then quickly slow back down at the current 40 mph speed zone.

These amendments are intended to provide consistency, clarity and a more detailed layout of the speed zones on the CTH System. Additionally, the increased accuracy allows for more reliable regulations for the traveling public to follow and enforcement agencies to utilize.
