# Awarding \$1,634,310 in ARPA Funds for Homeless Services Matching Grant Initiatives

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2022, the Rock County Board of Supervisors passed resolution 22-3A-452 allocating \$3,000,000 of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to implement a matching grant program to encourage the development of initiatives by local non-profit organizations and other local municipalities to address challenges related to homelessness; and,

**WHEREAS**, the resolution directed that the grant program would be overseen by the Homelessness Prevention Coordinator in the Human Services Department; and,

WHEREAS, the Homelessness Prevention Coordinator advertised the opportunity and solicited applications for funding from community organizations and municipalities in Rock County resulting in the submissions of 10 applications; and,

WHEREAS, an application review committee was formed comprised of individuals with subject matter expertise and leadership roles including: the Homelessness Prevention Coordinator, Director of Human Services, Human Services Deputy Director, Director of Planning and Development, Human Services Board Chair, Coordinator of Prevention and Community Engagement, and the Director of a Shelter and Homelessness Services agency from a neighboring County; and,

WHEREAS, the review committee evaluated applications according to a scoring rubric which assessed project goals and alignment with funding criteria, relevance of projects in reducing homelessness in Rock County, defined measurable outcomes, project budget, compliance with matching funds requirements, attention to equity for individuals experiencing homelessness, sustainability of the project; and,

WHEREAS, the review committee approved applications and recommends funding for the following entities and amounts: City of Janesville (\$891,880), ECHO (\$25,000), Safe Families for Children (\$38,750), Project 16:49 (\$84,170), Beloit Cares (\$5,000), House of Mercy (\$101,930), Red Roadhouse (\$196,000), Janesville Mobilizing 4 Change (\$61,420), Youth to Youth 4 Change (\$50,000), Family Promise of Greater Beloit (\$180,160) for a total amount of \$1,634,310; and,

WHEREAS, upon authorization, the Human Services Department will initiate contracts with each awardee, which will specify the terms of use of the awarded funds and define quarterly reporting requirements on project tasks, spending, and outcomes, which will be monitored by the Homelessness Prevention Coordinator.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly assembled this 12th day of January, 2023 hereby authorizes the release of \$1,634,310 of American Rescue Plan Act funds to Homelessness Services Matching Grant Program applicants per the recommendations of the application review committee.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Human Services Department to enter into a contract with each funding recipient.

## **Executive Summary**

## Awarding \$1,634,310 in ARPA Funds for Homeless Services Matching Grant Initiatives

This resolution authorizes the release of a total of \$1,634,310 million dollars in ARPA funding to one municipality and nine agencies through a Matching Grant program for Community initiatives to combat homelessness.

On March 10, 2022, the Rock County Board of Supervisors passed resolution 22-3A-452 allocating \$3,000,000 of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to implement a matching grant program to encourage the development of initiatives by local non-profit organizations and other local municipalities to address challenges related to homelessness and directed that the grant program would be overseen by the Homelessness Prevention Coordinator in the Human Services Department. The resolution also directed that Rock County ARPA funds must be matched at \$1.00 ARPA funds for every \$1.00 provided through private, nongovernmental agencies and local municipalities with populations under 8,000, and a match of Rock County ARPA funds in the amount of \$1.00 for every \$4.00 provided by local municipalities with a population over 8,000.

The Homelessness Prevention Coordinator advertised the opportunity and solicited applications for funding from community organizations and municipalities in Rock County resulting in the submissions of 10 qualifying applications. An application review committee was formed comprised of individuals with subject matter expertise and leadership roles including: the Homelessness Prevention Coordinator, the Director of Human Services, the Director of Planning and Development, Human Services Deputy Director, the Human Services Board Chair, the Coordinator of Prevention and Community Engagement, and the Director of a shelter and homelessness services agency from a neighboring County. This review committee evaluated applications according to a scoring rubric which assessed project goals and alignment with funding criteria, relevance of projects in reducing homelessness in Rock County, defined measurable outcomes, project budget, compliance with matching funds requirements, attention to equity for individuals experiencing homelessness, and sustainability of the project. The committee recommends funding the proposals from the ten applicants which are listed in the summary table below.

Upon authorization from the County Board, the Human Services Department will initiate contracts with each awardee. The contracts will specify the terms of use of the awarded funds and define quarterly reporting requirements on project tasks, spending, and outcomes, which will be monitored by the Homelessness Prevention Coordinator.
