Who is on the Team?

Rock County Drug Court is a collaborative effort between the Rock County Courts, Rock County Sheriff's Office, Rock County District Attorney's Office, State Public Defender's Office, County Administration, WI Department of Corrections, and Rock County Human Services.

Goals and Benefits:

- To break the cycle of drug and/or alcohol use.
- To reduce criminal justice costs by reducing drug addiction and street crime.
- To reduce incarceration for participants who present a low risk to public safety.
- To provide a fully integrated and comprehensive treatment program.
- To enhance personal, academic, and employment abilities among participants.



Eligibility Criteria:

Potential candidates meeting the following criteria will be considered for admission to the Rock County Drug Court Program:

- An established resident of Rock County
- Court referrals must be Rock County case
- ATR referrals must be supervised by Rock County probation agents
- Must be 18 years of age or older
- Offense results from a crime motivated by substance use disorder
- Each participant will need to meet intensive outpatient (IOP) treatment criteria
- The Drug Court Candidate must voluntarily agree to abide by all Drug Court Program rules, be willing and physically able to participate in the program, and further agree to abide by any future modifications to said rules while in the Drug Court Program
- High risk/High need as indicated on validated criminogenic and clinical assessments used by the program

The Rock County Drug Court Program

began in 2007 after Rock County applied for and received a Treatment Alternatives and Diversion (TAD) grant. Drug Court Case Managers oversee the fourteen month treatment program for those participating in the Rock County Drug Court. Treatment is designed for non-violent participants with substance abuse issues.

Entry into the Program requires a Drug Court contract agreement between the Rock County District Attorney's Office, Defense Counsel, and the participant. Entry also requires a plea of guilty or no contest to current charges in exchange for potential reduction or dismissal of those charges or other sentencing concessions made upon successful completion of the Program. Participants may also enter the program through a referral from the Department of Corrections.

To be eligible for Drug Court the participant must be a Rock County resident. Violent felony offenders or those convicted of a violent misdemeanor offense within the last three years are not eligible.

Program Overview:

Upon entrance to the program each participant will receive an individualized criminogenic risk-need assessment and full bio-psychosocial assessment to determine areas of strengths and needs. Based on these assessments, the individual will be required to participate in treatment groups as recommended by the Treatment Team.

Each participant will receive intensive Case Management to monitor and support the individual in the community. Participants are required to report to the Drug Court office on a regular basis and submit to random drug tests. Clients are required to appear weekly before Judge Barbara McCrory for review of their treatment and program progress.

Fees:

A payment of \$100.00 is required at the initial intake session. Payment of \$10.00 per week is required thereafter until program participation is completed. *Fees are waived for DOC referrals.

Program Details:

MORAL RECONATION THERAPY (MRT)

Instruction designed to restructure participant's thinking patterns. The goal is to discover the pattern of thinking that leads to inappropriate behavior, and develop alternative reactions that will bring more desirable results.

SUD Education:

Course designed to enable the participant to achieve lasting abstinence from substance abuse. Participants learn the necessary skills to function independently in the community while managing their recovery from addiction.
