Rock Haven employees thank the Board of Supervisors for Resolution R-2023-233 American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Premium Pay for Rock Haven employees. This secondary benefit from the Rock County Board of Supervisors serves as appreciation for the challenging work staff faced due to the COVID-19 pandemic and until the compensation wage grid becomes effective in October. The benefit is pro-rated based on an employee's signed budgeted full-time equivalency (FTE). The maximum amount awarded is \$2000.00.

Health and Wellness: Please remember that routine dental, podiatry, vision, and hearing tests can be coordinated through your unit clinical team (some residents may elect to complete these services within the community).

Rock Haven has collaborated hospice service agreements with Agrace, Promedica, St Croix, and Mercyhealth Hospice. Please note that if the Hospice agency does not update the agreements, the facility will not enroll new service admissions. Notifications have gone out to all hospice agencies. The facility has updated current agreements with Agrace, Promedica, and St Croix. We are accepting new admissions to these agencies when seeking hospice services.

Infection Control Corner

Hand washing vs hand sanitizing facts:

- 1. Hand sanitizing is the preferred method of hand hygiene due to its quick accessibility, less harsh on our skin, and has been shown to kill germs more effectively than hand washing.
- 2. Wash your hands for at least 15 seconds. The same is for hand sanitizing, 15 seconds or until dry.
- 3. Top three areas most missed during hand hygiene: thumbs, fingertips, and between fingers.
- 4. Protect yourself by keeping your hands clean and asking those who care for you to also clean their hands when visiting.
- 5. Wearing gloves alone when caring for someone is not enough protection against germs, hand hygiene before and after gloves is recommended.


