Schollmeyer County Park 2767 East Trail Drive, Beloit, WI

This 1 acre undeveloped park on Turtle Creek provides public access for kayaking and fishing.

Sugar River County Park

11317 South Nelson Road, Brodhead, WI

This 7 acre park is mostly unimproved, but has a sandy canoe launch on the Sugar River with limited parking.

Sweet-Allyn Country Park 7149 South CTH J, Beloit, WI

This popular park was the first Rock County Park, created in 1945. Low grassy banks provides easy access to Turtle Creek. The softball diamond was constructed, through the efforts and donations of local citizens. Amenities include a pavilion, picnic tables, playground, and restrooms.

Turtle Creek Access @ 140 5501 South State Hwy 140, Clinton, WI

This 1 acre park provides parking and kayak/canoe access to Turtle Creek.

Turtle Creek Parkway 6528 South Smith Road, Clinton, WI

The 4 acre park includes a kayak/canoe launch to Turtle Creek, a formal rental facility, and the Historic Five Arch Tiffany Bridge.

Walt Lindemann Sportsman's County Park 3411 North US HWY 51, Janesville, WI

This 10 acre park is one of the most popular parks in Rock County! The highlight of this park is the white tailed deer display. The amenities include a pavilion, picnic tables, playground, grills, drinking water, and restrooms.



Dogs are allowed in Rock County Parks all year. Dogs must be on a six-foot maximum leash at all times and kept out of any posted prohibited areas.

Pavilion reservations are made by contacting the Rock County Parks Department. If the shelter is not reserved, it is available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

A permit is required to launch all watercraft at Gibbs Lake, Happy Hollow, and Royce Dallman Parks from April 15 -October 31. All users are required to purchase a single day or seasonal Rock County launch pass. Registration materials are available on site.



Rock County Parks Guide



This brochure is a brief guide to the 22 parks & 4 trails owned and/or maintained by Rock County Parks Division.

Airport County Park

1020 West Knilans Road, Janesville, WI

This small 2 acre park provides an excellent spot to observe aircraft taking off and landing at the Southern Wisconsin Regional Airport.

Avon Wildlife Area

9731 South Main Street, Brodhead, WI

This 6 acre wildlife reserve on the Sugar River is totally undeveloped.

Beckman Mill County Park 11450 South CTH H, Beloit, WI

This beautiful 52 acre park consists of a hardwood forest, restored oak savannah, wetlands, boardwalk, and trails. The highlight of this park is the restored Beckman-Howe Mill, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The mill is open for public tours on Saturdays and Sundays from May to October by the Friends of Beckman Mill. Amenities include a pavilion, picnic tables, drinking water, fishing pier, covered bridge, playground, and restrooms.

Carver-Roehl County Park 4907 South Carvers Rock Road, Clinton, WI

This park contains outstanding limestone outcroppings throughout the 52 acre park. It is Rock County's second oldest park dating from 1950. A wide variety of plants, trees, and a self-guided tree identification course provide an excellent place to observe wildlife along the hiking trails. A historic grave of one of Rock County's oldest settlers is located at the southern end of this park. Amenities include a pavilion, gazebo, picnic tables, drinking water, restrooms, and playground.

Gibbs Lake County Park 9103 West Gibbs Lake Road, Janesville, WI

This is Rock County's largest park, almost 278 acres, enclosing 3/4 of the shoreline of Gibbs Lake and the north half of Little Gibbs Lake. This park is a popular fishing location, with a boat launch located on the north shore of Gibbs Lake. The park features equestrian and hiking trails. A separate equestrian parking lot is located east of the main lot, on Gibbs Lake Road. Amenities include a pavilion, picnic tables, grills, drinking water, benches and restrooms.

Glacial River Trail Multiple Trail Heads

This 52 mile mostly paved path runs along HWY 26 through Rock and Jefferson County. Rock County maintains 7 miles of the trail.

Hanover Wildlife Area

2665 South CTH H, Janesville, WI

This 27 acre park is left totally undeveloped as a wildlife refuge.

Happy Hollow County Park 1731 West Happy Hollow Road, Janesville, WI

This 185 acre park includes a boat landing with access to the Rock River, equestrian trails, and hiking trails. There are roughly 7 miles of trails that travel through grasslands, wetlands and heavily wooded areas. Amenities include picnic tables, drinking water, and restrooms.

Ice Age County Park

5504 North Sable Drive, Janesville, WI

This 3 acre undeveloped park provides a rustic trail access to the Ice Age Multi-use Trail.

Indianford County Park 8901 CTH F, Edgerton, WI

This 1 acre park offers excellent fishing on both sides of the shoreline at the Indianford dam. Amenities include parking, restrooms, and an unimproved canoe launch.

The Janesville-Milton Ice Age Multi-Use Trail Trail Head - 4101 Kennedy Road, Janesville, WI Trail Head - 3890 East Manogue Road, Milton, WI

This 3.2 mile trail was a former railroad bed and is unpaved and covered with crushed stone. Permitted trail use include equestrian, hiking, dog, walking, and bicycling. No ATV's are allowed.

Koshkonong Lake Access County Park 1005 East Lakeside Drive, Edgerton, WI

This 13 acre flood-prone park is completely undeveloped.

Lee County Park 9205 East CTH W, Clinton, WI

This 39 acre park was originally bought by the town of Clinton from the Lee family and the town donated it to Rock County in 1966. The park has a wooded area with a trail system, prairie area, and large open field with a softball diamond. Amenities include a pavilion, picnic tables and restrooms.

Magnolia Bluff County Park 4002 North Croak Road, Evansville, WI

This 122 acre park contains the second highest point in Rock County. A scenic overlook from the bluff provides a feast for the eyes. It is a wonderful place to watch the sunset. The park features equestrian and hiking trails. Amenities include picnic tables, equestrian parking lot, restrooms, grills, and a pavilion.

Miller Farm Wetland Conservancy 8104 North CTH H, Edgerton, WI

This 59 acre unimproved park is located at the confluence of the Yahara River and Rock River. The majority of the park is floodplain and wetlands.

Murwin County Park 6407 West Caledonia Road, Edgerton, WI

This 38 acre park is a popular fishing spot, kayak launch, and picnic location on the Yahara river. Amenities include drinking water, restrooms, picnic tables, kayak launch, and parking.

The Peace Trail

Trail Head: 3300 West Tripp Road, Janesville, WI

This 13.1 mile trail connects Janesville to Beloit. Rock County maintains 4.6 miles of The Peace Trail. The bike trail was started in 1993 and the final paving of the trail was completed in 2022.

Pelishek-Tiffany Nature Trail Trail Head: 119 Lake Shore Road, Clinton, WI

Six miles of trail runs from Clinton to Allen's Grove on a retired railroad bed. Acquired by the county in 1995, the trail is used for hiking, bicycling, birdwatching, and horseback riding. Amenities include a restroom at the trail head and multiple rest shelters and benches along the trail.

Rock River Heritage County Park 5801 North River Road, Janesville, WI

This 178 acre County Park is the newest park in the County system. This park has a beautiful view of the Rock River, hiking, a man-made pond, and many buildings. A new trail system is under development.

Royce Dallman County Park 11500 North Charley Bluff Road, Milton, WI

The 4 acre park is an excellent landing to launch small boats onto Lake Koshkonong. Amenities include a pavilion, restrooms, and parking.
